

The war was over, and peace finally settled in Europe and the Pacific, and Diane had spare time to handcraft a Raggedy Ann doll. In the autumn of 1947 she wanted to give it to a destitute child for Christmas in the Los Angeles area, in which her and her husband Bill lived. Diane gave it to Bill and asked him to give it to an organization that did such things for the needy children at Christmas time. Well, her husband, searched for such an agency and found that there wasn't one to be had, so he told his wife the sad news. Determined that this doll would be in the hands of a child at Christmas, she told her husband to create one. Now Bill a Marine Major and a reservist in Los Angeles, California was ready and more than willing to take on the challenge to start this new project in the fall of 1947.

Major Bill Hendricks, USMCR, and fellow Marine reservists from Los Angeles collected and distributed 5000 toys to needy children in the area in that year. The 1947 "Toys for Tots" pilot project had succeeded so well, that the Marine Corps adopted the "Toys for Tots" program in 1948 and launched it into a nationwide campaign, with each Marine Reserve Unit collecting and distributing the toys for their own community. This has successfully been fulfilled every year since.

The initial objective of the "Toys for Tots" campaigns is to bring the joy of Christmas to America's needy children, and this objective still lives on today. Additionally the Toys for Tots Foundation, which formed in 1991 by the command of the U. S. Marine Corps in accordance with a Memorandum of Understanding with the Commander, Marine Forces Reserve, desires to play an active role in the development of one our nation's most valuable natural resources, our children; to unite all the members of our local community for a common goal. Last but not least, to contribute to a better community in the future.

The goal in 1947 was to provide a toy to needy children at Christmas and from 1947 through 1979 the "Toys for Tots" program employed both used and new toys. While Marines were on drill weekends during October, November, and December they worked on refurbishing used toys, and collecting new and used toys and the distribution of the toys to local social welfare agencies, church groups, and other local community organizations to distribute the toys. As the years passed the Marine Reserves built up a good working relationship with these local community associations. From 1980, things changed, The Secretary of Defense's Total Force Program changed the role the reserves had in America's defense posture. Time for training was more valuable, on weekend drills. Other factors to change what toys were collected were the safety concerns of used toys and the how "hand-me-down" toys would fit into the goal of building good self-esteem and message of hope the Marines wanted to give to the needy children. Something a shiny new toy would give.

The Commander, Marine Force Reserve in 1999, delegated the authority of the "Toys for Tots" program to the President, Marine Toys for Tots Foundation to approve and manage local "Toys for Tots" campaigns in communities that don't have a Marine Reserve Unit. This way "Toys for Tots" can reach out throughout all 50 states. By doing this the Foundation can authorize selected Marine Corps League Detachments or local community organizations to conduct campaigns in their community.

Wreaths Across America



The Division didn't take part in a major action again until 1958 when elements participated in the U.S. intervention into the Lebanon crisis of 1958. 2nd Marine Division units helped to reinforce Guantanamo Bay during the Cuban Missile Crisis in 1962 and landed in the Dominican Republic in 1965 as part of Operation Power Pack. Other peacekeeping operations carried on by the Division include being part of the Multi National Peacekeeping Force in Lebanon from August of 1982 until February 1984. The Division suffered the loss of 241 Marines and Sailors during the 1983 Beirut barracks bombing. Towards the end of the 1980s, Division Marines participated in Operation Just Cause, the invasion of Panama.

The 1990s began with elements of the Division participating in Operation Sharp Edge, the evacuation of American and allied civilians out of war torn Liberia. This was followed by deployments to Saudi Arabia in support of Op-

eration Desert Shield and then the liberation of Kuwait in Operation Desert Storm. Following the war, elements of the Division participated in Operation Provide Comfort.

Elements of the 2nd Marine Division deployed to Kuwait in early 2003 to reinforce the 1st Marine Expeditionary Force. These units formed a Marine Expeditionary Brigade (MEB) and were called Task Force Tarawa. Task Force Tarawa crossed into Iraq on the first day of the ground war with the initial task of seizing Jalibah airfield in southern Iraq. Following this, the Task Force pushed north and took part in a major battle in the town of Nasiriyah. After the war, these Marines were moved north to Al Kut where they provided security and stabilization operations in central Iraq.

The 2nd Marine Division returned to Iraq in January 2005 to relieve the 1st Marine Division in Al Anbar province in western Iraq. They remained there conducting security and stabilization operations until early 2006.
