News From the Hill

Take notice all military retirees and those who are planning a military retirement.

This alert comes from Rear Admiral USN Ret Tom Marfiak who obtained this info from an Air Force Association written by BG Bob Clements. I published this article some months ago in our newsletter and it's on the web site again. This time with more emphasis and detailed report. This is a long article and I won't be able to take up two pages of information. ↓

News From the Hill, Continued

The Congressional Budget Office, (CBO) has already drafted a proposed legislation that would basically reduce our TRICARE for Life benefits to a system whereby we pay deductibles and co-pays up to \$6,301.00 the first year for you and your spouse, with future years being indexed to increase with inflation. (Than you have Medicare to think about).

The one item of most interest to Retired Military is in Article 189 in CBO report. If approved by Congress the first wave would hit in 2011 and would hit hard. It would initiate cost sharing to require retirees to pay the first \$525.00 of medical cost and 50% of the next \$4,725.00 for a first year total cost of \$2,888.00 per person. It would be indexed to increase with inflation. Also on page 189 of the CBO there is a strong recommendation to eventually eliminate the TFL program altogether as it is too expensive.

Folks you need to really get on the horn and notify your Representatives and let them know your feelings and possible financial hardship this recommendation by CBO will be bring to you and your Spouse. Remember....TFL is an "EARNED BENEFIT" that's been granted by a previous Congress.

Juniper Ranch is owned by Stan Meholchick a "Life Member".


