


The Battleship USS Tennessee, BB43


I received an email from Paul Sullivan, NW Division, Vice Chief Devil Dog about a member in the Department who is a survivor of Pearl Harbor. *Ray Garland*– Ray was stationed aboard the Battleship USS Tennessee 43 during that fatal morning of December 7, 1941. According to Ray he was in the process of hoisting the morning colors when a stream of unknown planes came overhead and dropped an object from their planes. It wasn't until the planes banked away from battleship row that he made out the markings of a Japanese round red ball on their wing tips. I wonder how many times has Ray looked toward the skies these days when he hears an aircraft flying overhead?? I know I do when I hear the sound of the rotor blades of a huey chopper going, woop, woop., woop. Congratulations Ray for surviving Dec 7th and all of WWII. And thanks for your service to our Country.
