The Department of Idaho or annual State MCL Convention is now accomplished. I would like to receive your thoughts on this possible project.

I believe that having a booth has been discussed, and then not acted on because of the rather high charges that fair managers levy on booth sponsors. VETS HEALTH CARE EXEMPT FROM BUDGET CUTS

nounced April 23 that veterans' health care programs under the Department of Veterans Affairs will not be subject to budget cuts as a result of sequestration. The Budget Control Act of 2011, which included sequestration as a mechanism for cutting federal programs if a deficit spending agreement wasn't reached, specifically exempted veterans' benefits but had no clear statement about what would happen to veterans' medical care expenses. Sequestration is looming because Congress and the White House failed to reach an agreement on a 10-year, \$1.2 trillion deficit reduction plan. Read More

#### Warhawk Air Museum Veterans History Project

We are proud to preserve our veterans histories during times of wars in which they served. The Warhawk Air Museum partnered with the Library of Congress 7 years ago to preserve our veterans' stories on film. To date, we have preserved over 700 stories from WWII, Korea, Vietnam and Cold War Era, Desert Storm, and all other conflicts including the present day war. It is important that veterans preserve their own histories so that future generations of Americans will benefit from real live history lessons.

The filming will take approximately 2 hours and can be scheduled with the Warhawk Air Museum at 208.465.6446. The program is free and we give a copy of the DVD interview to the veteran as a gift to keep forever. Please do not let your history be lost. Every veteran is a piece of the fabric which holds our great nation together and your experiences are important to preserve.

RICHMOND, Calif. (AP) — Firing its 16-inch guns in the Arabian Sea, the U.S.S. Iowa shuddered. As the sky turned orange, a blast of heat from the massive guns washed over the battleship. This was the Iowa of the late 1980s, at the end of its active duty as it escorted reflagged Kuwaiti oil tankers from the Persian Gulf through the Strait of Hormuz during the Iran-Iraq war.

Some 25 years later, following years of aging in the San Francisco Bay area's "mothball fleet," the 887-foot long ship that once carried President Franklin Roosevelt to a World War II summit to meet with Churchill, Stalin and Chiang Kai Shek is coming to life once again as it is being prepared for what is most likely its final voyage.

Not far from where "Rosie the Riveters" built ships in the 1940s at the Port of Richmond, the 58,000-ton battlewagon is undergoing restoration for towing May 20 through the Golden Gate, then several hundred miles south to the Port of Los Angeles in San Pedro. There it is to be transformed into an interactive naval museum.

On May 1, ownership of the Iowa was officially transferred from the U.S. Navy to the Pacific Battleship Center, the nonprofit organization that has been restoring the boat for its new mission.
